CPEEP FUNDS ENERGY UPGRADES

LIGHTING SYSTEMS

Compact fluorescent lights (CFLs), occupancy sensor light switches, LED exit signs, T12 to T8 conversions

HEATING AND COOLING SYSTEMS

AC unit tune ups

TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE

Advice on high efficiency air conditioners, furnaces, water heaters, windows, insulation, roofing and skylights

EDUCATIONAL MATERIALS

Energy Efficiency Educational Materials are available to educate parents, staff, and children about efficiency and conservation



HOW IT WORKS

- Eligible child care centers will receive an on-site energy assessment,
- Follow-up includes a written report with recommendations and expected savings,
- CPEEP supplies the contractors and manages the installations,
- Centers see lower utility bills by reducing energy use.

ELIGIBILITY

Any licensed child care center operating in the electric utility service area of Pacific Gas and Electric Company is eligible. Priority is given to:

- Centers serving low-income families,
- Centers that have the greatest potential for energy savings, and
- Centers housed in buildings at least 25 years old.
